CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Although it doesn't feel like a full year has passed since I last wrote my Annual Report, I am very pleased to be able to bring you my Chairman's summary of the Parish Council year.

Scaleby Parish Council is in the enviable position as being a quiet Council. We enjoy working for the benefit of our parish although things don't always go to plan!

Unfortunately we didn't have much success with our litter pick in 2015! We don't know whether we chose a bad evening or whether the event wasn't publicised enough, however we didn't have any volunteers turn up! We are going to try and repeat the exercise this year - details are in this newsletter. Please do come along and join in if you can. We do have litter picking equipment stored in the Hall now in case anyone wants a quick go outside of the normal organised evening. There are strict safety considerations to adhere to so please make sure you read the guidelines before starting. I am happy to advise and ensure you have access to the Hall for you to get the equipment when you need it.

Another area we have struggled with is organising our repeater First Aid training. We had very low numbers of people wishing to take part so had to cancel the event. We can still organise some basic training, including defibrillator training, if you would like us to do so? Give Sarah our Clerk a ring to reserve a slot if you are interested, there is further information later on regarding this also.

I'm also not very happy to report that we are *STILL* trying to register the Village Hall with Land Registry. We are very hopeful this will be completed over the next 12 months!

Onto more positive matters, we haven't forgotten about the broadband initiative. Our Champion, Clive Moth, continues to keep the Clerk informed of all goings on and are very pleased to report the positive news about local cabinets being activated.

We were also very pleased to have repeated the Children's Summer Play Scheme yet again. This year we had 106 children attend over the three days. We hope the 2016 dates (details on the front cover) will be just as successful. Please do ensure you continue to support these events so we can justify putting them on.

The Parish Council is in a strong financial position and as such we opted to keep our precept static again. This is despite us losing a substantial proportion of our income as one of our main funding streams has been abolished.

We have managed to support the Village Hall, Churchyard as well as the Great North Air Ambulance this year with financial contributions. We were also pleased to help the start-up of the Border Rambler Voluntary Bus Service - hopefully this service will soon be coming to Scaleby. Information on this follows. We are currently finalising our revised 2016/17 budgets and we would welcome any suggestions you have to make as to suitable projects or initiatives that would benefit our parish. Don't also forget that we have a grant scheme in place for parish based groups - contact the Clerk if you would like further information on this or would like to apply for a grant for your community group.

In conclusion, I would like to give thanks to all the Councillors for their invaluable contribution, to the Clerk for all her work and also to City Councillors Bowman and Bainbridge and County Councillor Mallinson for their support over the past twelve months. Linda Thompson, Chairman.

All eligible passengers will be able to use NoW Card concessionary travel. Border Rambler have been running since September 2015 through the flooding and adverse weather this winter, we have never missed a service day yet and have carried over 1000 passengers.

DOG FOULING

An increase in the amount of dog fouling in our parish has been noted. As you are all already aware, dog fouling is unsightly, unpleasant and can pose a risk to human health.

While the majority of dog owners behave responsibly and pick up after their dogs, Carlisle City Council remain keen to tackle the problem of dog mess left by a minority of irresponsible dog owners. Please make sure you're not one of the bad guys!

Some Golden Rules to help you are:

- Take a supply of bags out with you whenever you walk your dog
- Pick the mess up straight away, seal the bag and place the waste in a bin
- Do not throw the bag over a fence, hang it in a tree or leave it on the pathway
- Make a note of public bins on your route so waste can be disposed of properly, and if this is not possible, take it home and put it in your own bin

Put simply, it is an offence for a person in charge of a dog to fail to remove faeces forthwith. Being unaware that your dogs has fouled is no defence and it carries a Fixed Penalty of £80 which if unpaid leads to prosecution in a magistrate's court. There, the maximum fine for failing to pick up after a dog is £1,000.



However, without information from residents it is extremely difficult to deal with those responsible for the problem that affects everyone in the local community.
