We set our precept (the tax we levy annually) at our November meeting and we are pleased to let you know that we have kept the amount the same as last year. We hope this is welcome news? MEALS ON WHEELS

At the moment Brampton Community Centre are trying to recruit new drivers to deliver Meals on Wheels. Drivers report the experience to be very enjoyable and find it very worthwhile, with some lovely

residents being delivered to. Additional drivers are now being recruited.

BORDER RAMBLER BUS

As the Border Rambler moves towards its third year of operation, we thought it would be helpful to give an update on the Thursday Hethersgill, Scaleby service. The community continues to use the bus and we would welcome any suggestions on ways in which more members of the community could be encouraged to use the bus? We have been helped by the Hallburn Wind Farm which has made a grant to us, which helps with the running of the service.

We will be putting notes on the bus about the Christmas timetable.

Turning to the next 12 months, we are aware that the County Council budget will be under pressure but as yet we do not know what the implications could be for community transport. SCALEBY VILLAGE HALL

Various events have taken place throughout the summer at the Village Hall and have included two 'Pop up Pubs' - one in June and one n September. Both have been very successful bringing together both local villagers and people from outside the Scaleby area. It has been lovely to see newcomers popping along to support these social events.

The most recent village event was the 'Beacon of Light' A Nations Tribute to commemorate 100 years of Remembrance on 11th November. More than 140 people came along to be part of this national historic

event which started at Scaleby Castle with a spectacular fireworks display and followed with a torch light procession walk back to the village hall. The tribute to the nation commenced with the formal commemorative speech and a reading of the soldiers poem, followed by a minutes silence and the bugle playing of the last post. The Beacon of Light was lit and everyone was part of a procession which was taking place up and down the UK to commemorate 100 years of the end of WW1. In true style the celebration of this momentous event was enjoyed with an old time pie and pea supper and a sing song of the war time music

The village hall continue to bring regular events to the community for everyone to enjoy and we see weekly and monthly activities such as Sewing Group, Flower Club, Upholstery Group, Natter Club and Yoga classes. WATER PRESSURE

Some households may have noticed a drop in the water pressure to their property. You may remember the recent works carried out through Scaleby Hill. These works included the supply for United Utilities who installed a pressure reduction valve. Water pressure and flow rates are set and governed by Ofwat and give the minimum levels required. If you feel that your water pressure or flow rate is unacceptable then you should contact United Utilities directly.
